How many lessons?

The amount of lessons you will need will depend on a number of factors. The amount of driving practice you get, whether this is in a tuition car or private practice can vary. The DVSA's own surveys suggest that the average test candidate takes an average of 42.6 tuition hours plus at least 20 private practice hours.

This doesn't apply to everyone as general surveys include all candidates with a variety of backgrounds and ages from 16 to 90 but it is intended to make you realistically assess your requirements.

I can give you a guide that is usually within +/- 5 Hours. If you pay in a block and don't feel you will need to use them all I will refund any lessons not used.

You will need to be able to demonstrate that you are a safe and confident driver and can drive unaccompanied safely.

I will show how to drive defensively, and to apply the right attitude when driving, to show patience and understanding. As you're driving becomes more technical, the easier it will become.

Driving is a very serious task but it can also be fun and will change your life.

Theory test

I can help you with this as the lessons progress we can identify signs and markings and I can advise about the rules and regulations in the Highway Code and show you how to identify potential hazards. I can guide you to the best software available to help you. **You need to put some hours in to study; I cannot do it for you.**

The theory test is made up of two parts – the questions part and the hazard perception part. Some of the multiple choice questions will be presented to you in the form of a case study. A case study shows a scenario on which five questions will be based. The subject of the scenario will focus on real life examples and experiences that you might encounter when driving.

The pass mark for the multiple choice part is 43 correct answers out of 50 questions. For the hazard perception part it is 44 out of a possible 75 points. You must pass both parts of the theory test in the same sitting to obtain your theory test pass certificate.

When will I be ready for my driving test?

The **frequency** and **duration** of tuition and practice hours will also play a big part of this. It is expensive to sit a practical driving test. I can guide you and reassure you and common sense will tell you when you are ready.

You need to be able to drive safely and unaided and with confidence. You will need to sit and pass a theory test before you are able to book a practical driving test.
